Graduates of the Jefferson School of Nursing, Jefferson College of Health Professions at Thomas Jefferson University consistently achieve pass rates on the nursing licensure examinations that are among the highest for all the baccalaureate, associate degree and diploma programs in the Philadelphia region and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
