Population Health (PopH) is an academic and professional field that draws upon diverse disciplines to create a new paradigm for health improvement that engages all key stakeholders that impact the delivery of health services. Health systems in the U.S. and around the world are shifting from volume to value.

There are three tracks in the program (science, management, and employer) to allow students to focus their studies on the science of population health improvement or the population health management strategies used in healthcare.

Science - This track provides critical knowledge and skills to effectively address population health issues across the spectrum of populations. It is a broad education applicable to administrative lead positions in healthcare delivery organizations, health insurance companies, government, public health agencies, and health-related non-profit organizations. It is also ideal for general education of professionals new to or considering population health endeavors.

Management - designed for professionals in healthcare and provides a deeper focus on the clinical application of population health principles both for strategy and management.

Employer - Designed for professionals in business and healthcare. Provides a deeper focus on the application of population health principles for employees populations within organizations.


